Ordinance By The City Council Of The City Of Live Oak, Texas, Calling For A General Election Held Jointly With Various Entities To Be Held On May 3, 2025, For The Purpose Of Electing Three (3) City Council Members Place 1, Place 3, And Place 5, Making Provision For The Conduct Of A General Election, Resolving Other Matters Incident And Related To Such Election.

WHEREAS, the City of Live Oak, Texas finds and determines that it is necessary to call and hold an election in accordance with its City Charter, Article IV and Article IX, for the election of three (3) Council Members – Place 1, Place 3 and Place 5; and

WHEREAS, the City of Live Oak, Texas finds and determines that holding such an election for City Council is in the public interest.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL THE CITY OF LIVE OAK, TEXAS:

- I. An election shall be held in and throughout the City of Live Oak, Texas on May 3, 2025 for the purpose of electing three (3) Council Members Place 1, Place 3 and Place 5 on the Live Oak City Council for full terms of two (2) years.
- II. At said election the candidates receiving the highest number of votes for three (3) Council Members Place 1, Place 3 and Place 5 respectively, shall be declared elected. Any candidate desiring to have his or her name on the official ballot of said election, shall at least **one hundred eight (108)** days prior to and not less than **seventy eight (78)** days prior to said election day, January 15, 2025 through February 14, 2025 (February 18th for a write-in candidate) with the City Secretary an application in writing in the form prescribed by the Texas Election Code requesting that his or her name be placed on the official ballot and designating the position for which he or she is running as a candidate. That any person failing to file said written application for candidacy by the time aforesaid, shall not be entitled to have his or her name printed on the official ballot.
- III. The names of all eligible candidates whose applications have been duly and timely filed shall be placed on the ballot pursuant to a drawing as provided by law.
- **IV**. All qualified voters of said City shall be entitled to vote in said election.
- V. The Bexar County Elections Administrator is hereby appointed as the Early Voting Clerk and shall conduct early voting in said election, as required by law. The address for the early voting clerk is:

The city contracts with the audit firm of Armstrong Vaughan & Associates, P.C. to perform our annual external audit. Mr. Phil Vaughan, CPA oversaw our audit. Mr. Vaughan will be in attendance to answer any questions and provide any required communications.

Some brief financial highlights for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, will be presented. As you will hear in the brief presentation, the city has received an "unmodified" audit opinion. This opinion means that the City's audited financial statements for the year ending September 30, 2024, are free from any material misstatements and that Management and City Council can be assured that the financial reports given throughout the year clearly represent the City's financial condition at the time of the reports. This is the opinion we strive for every year. The City has been given a clean audit review.

The City of Live Oak will again be sending its annual comprehensive financial report, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, to the Government Finance Officer Association (GFOA) to be considered for a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting award. The City has received this award for the last seventeen years.
