If you already own a cat or dog over three months of age and reside in Live Oak, please remember to obtain a pet license from us. For pets with proof of their annual rabies vaccination, the fee is \$5.00 for non-sterilized dogs and cats. Licenses for spayed or neutered dogs and cats are only \$2.00.

If your pet is spayed/neutered and micro-chipped, the license is FREE! Licensing not only aids the Animal Care and Control staff with the pet population in Live Oak, but it allows for easy and quick reuniting of families with their lost pet.

BIRD WATCHING IN LIVE OAK

The San Antonio Audubon Society has listed Live Oak's Lake and Main Park as one of only 28 designated bird watching locations in the San Antonio Metro Area. The park's open areas, lake and woods make it the perfect location for a diverse mix of some of the 2,031 species of birds in Bexar County. The birding habitats of Live Oak can be broadly described as Post Oak Prairie or Blackland Prairie. The Audubon Society's web site provides a check list of birds that are common, uncommon and rare to our region. Memorial Day



Memorial Day is celebrated each year on the last Monday of the month of May. Memorial Day was established to honor the men and women who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. Previously known as Decoration Day, the holiday emerged after the American Civil War and has been extended to honor all Americans who have fallen in the service of our country.

Every year the City of Live Oak celebrates Memorial Day with several City wide activities. This year, activities have been expanded to include a street dance and festival following the annual Memorial Day Parade. The City of Live Oak's Memorial Day activities will take place on Saturday, May 25th, the weekend before Memorial Day.

As we celebrate Memorial Day this year, we invite you to take a couple minutes to walk through the Memorial Gardens at the corner of Shin Oak Drive and Oak Terrace, in front of the Fire Station and reflect upon

the monuments. Live Oak's tradition of honoring Veterans began in 1982 with the planting of a large oak tree at City Hall. This was followed by a Vietnam Memorial dedicated sometime before 2002, which was later moved to the Memorial Gardens at the Fire Station.

The Lion's Club continued the tradition of dedicating plaques recognizing Veterans had served in all other military campaigns beginning World War II in honor of WWII Veteran Colonel Toepperwein, who served as the Grand Marshall of the Memorial Day Parade in 2003. The WWII dedication was the first to be placed in the Memorial Garden. The following year, the Lion's Club dedicated the World War I Memorial and followed with each military campaign in the order in which they occurred. The plaques were relocated to their current position, in chronological order, a few years ago and two benches were donated as well.



Please join us on **May 25th** in front of Live Oak City Hall, 8001 Shin Oak Drive for an old fashioned street dance. The Shin Dig on Shin Oak will start at 3:00 p.m. Live music starts at 4:00 p.m. with three bands, and lasts until the final band finishes at 10:00 p.m. We will have food and craft vendors, along with displays of public works equipment, fire and police vehicles. Games2U will provide a mechanical bull, zip-line, bungee trampoline and rock climbing wall.

(If you are under the age of 18, your parents will need to sign a waiver for these activities.) Live Oak's favorite Big Green Gym Bus will be providing fun and excitement for children ages 2 - 7 years. Admission is free; bring your lawn chairs and plan on staying for the evening. Live Oak Fire Department

The tradition Dalmatians in firehouses dates back more than a century. When you think of a firehouse dog, chances are the image of a Dalmatian comes to mind. The breed has a proud tradition of serving

with firefighters that has been documented back about 300 years to England. The Dalmatian has a natural calming effect on horses. Prior to motorized vehicles, horses were used to pull fire engines. **Dalmatians** helped the horses cope with the frightening situations they faced in their work, guarded

the equipment from theft

and actively helped fight the fires and rescue people.

When fire equipment became motorized. Dalmatians continued to help on fire trucks at actual fires. Dogs have helped deploy equipment and even run into burning buildings and located victims to be rescued. Today, in many large cities, the Dalmatian stills stands guard on the fire truck while at the scene of fires and rescues. In its long history in the Fire Service, there are many reports of how Dalmatian have even rescued trapped firefighters.

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) has had their own beloved Dalmatian for 62 years. His name is Sparky. Sparky's appearance has changed somewhat over the years but he has remained the same loveable spokes-dog for NFPA. Sparky has a great website (http://www.sparky.org/) with many games that teach fire safety as well as being funny and entertaining. He even has his own book, "Sparky the Firedog" and stars in his movie "Sparky and the Run Away Robot." Emergency Management

Storm Damage Prevention

We are currently in severe weather season and hurricane season will begin on June 1st. We have seen a few storms and we have experienced some very high winds that have caused a considerable amount of damage. Fortunately most of it has been minor, such as tree branches, a few fences and a lot of lost roof shingles. Some damage was more significant. At least one large patio cover was destroyed along with a backyard shed and some siding.

Severe storms with high winds can damage your home. However, in some cases, it could have been prevented. Trees should be trimmed on a regular basis and any tree that appears diseased or dead probably should be removed, especially if they could damage vour home. Fences in need of repair may fall over, which would allow your pets to escape. Old metal sheds and patio covers that are in poor condition can literally be blown apart and may

cause other damage to your property.

Finally, when severe storms are predicted you can "storm proof" your property. Outdoor patio furniture, children toys, hanging plants, etc., may become flying objects. Prior to a storm, make sure these items are secure or pick them up and move them indoors.

As a reminder, the best way to stay in tune with the weather is with a NOAA weather radio, available from most electronic stores. They are fairly inexpensive and can alert you to the potential for severe weather day or night. For additional information contact Gary Woppert, the Emergency Management Coordinator at 653-9140. In South Texas our grass and weeds grow all year long even through harsh winters and drought seasons. High grass can also harbor rodents, skunks, snakes and other nuisance "critters". We have already had a report of a skunk spraying a local pet due to the high grass from the adjacent neighbor's yard. We ask that property owners continue to keep their grass below the twelve (12) inches in height to reduce this problem. Property owners and tenants are responsible for keeping their lawns mowed to the edge of the roadway.

In addition, please help us keep the trash and debris that is accumulated in public view to a minimum. Excessive trash can attract cats, dogs and other rodents. The fines for these violations are substantial and we ask that you do your part to make Live Oak a more beautiful city. Citations can be issued daily for the violation and the dollar amounts can be high. Homeowners can also contact the Utility Department at 210-653-9140, extensions 225 or 226 for dates on brush and bulk item pick-up.

Any complaints regarding code violations can be reported after normal business hours by calling 210-653-0033 or by contacting Code Compliance at 210-653-9140, extension 245, Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm. Porcupine Meatballs (Baked)

- 1 ½ pound lean ground beef
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 2/3 cup long-grain rice, uncooked
- 1/8 tsp. pepper
- ½ cup water
- 1 large can (15 oz.) tomato or spaghetti sauce
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 1 cup water
- 1 tsp. seasoned salt
- 2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

Mix ground beef with rice, ½ cup of water, chopped onion, seasoned salt, garlic powder and pepper. Shape ground beef mixture into 1½ inch balls. Place the meatballs in an ungreased 2 quart baking dish. Mix the remaining ingredients and pour over the meatballs. Cover and bake at 350° for about 45 minutes. Uncover and bake meatballs 15-20 minutes longer. May be served on top of rice, pasta or mashed potatoes. Serves 4-6.

Easy Turtle Candies

- 12 oz. unwrapped soft caramels
- 6 oz. (about 1 ½ cups toasted pecan halves)
- 8 oz. chocolate chips

Heat oven to 300°. Cover cookie sheet with foil and spray with nonstick cooking spray. Arrange the pecans halves in clusters of 3 or 4. Place a caramel in center of each pecan and bake just until candy is melted (9-10 min). Caramels may also be melted in microwave and spooned on top of pecans. Melt chocolate chips in microwave or over a double boiler. Spoon the melted chocolate over the caramel layer. Allow candy to set fully at room temperature or refrigerate for 30 minutes. Bring candy to room temperature before serving so caramel will soften.
