



Strength in Numbers Census 2020

Dear Residents.

Since 2018, staff has been working closely with the Census Bureau by providing updated city street addresses and census block data. Now, it's time for you get involved in the process and participate with the 2020 survey. To ensure your privacy, the designated city representative has complied with the rules under Title 13 of the U.S. Code for the protection of private information. The census data outcome is very important and will benefit our community tremendously. The data gathered through the questionnaire counts towards our increasingly diverse and growing population. By getting an accurate count, it will help plan and identify where our community needs are for new streets, public safety and new infrastructure. The Census count is also used to allocate seats in the U.S. House of Representatives as well as determine how the federal government will direct money to state governments and local organizations.

Beginning on April 1st, officially dubbed "Census Day," every Live Oak household will be receiving a postcard in the mail to participate in the 2020 Census survey. The postcard will also provide the information to participate online should you choose that format. Census canvassers will follow up by knocking on doors to conduct the surveys and gather information from residents that have not yet responded or completed the survey online or by hard copy. Canvassers will all be required to display their federal identification badge at all times during the visit. This official identification badge will prevent you from falling victim to a Census imposter. The City Council and I join together in thanking you for your support and participation in shaping the future of our community.



Our Beginning

The Live Oak community has always been big on celebrating the important occasions. With that in mind we proudly announce the 60th Diamond Anniversary of this wonderful community that began on April 18, 1960. With pride, we trace our beginnings back to 1960 when the original settlers farmed the land that we now know as Live Oak, Texas. They began the quest by making small purchases and formed a group of community leaders. With having no experience but a lot of determination and grit, they blazed a trail that all of their children and generations afterwards would follow.


The original settlers or "trail blazers" of the farming community would include family surnames that still exist today such as Engleman, Riedel, Fey, Albrecht, Schumann and Friesenhahn. Members of each of these families would play an intricate role coordinating the division of the city as we



now know it from an old German speaking community called Selma, Texas. They would incorporate and establish the new town and call it "Live Oak" with a population of 316 residents. Live Oak would be established as a city officially in 1960. The city was incorporated to avoid becoming a part of San Antonio and citizens felt that they would have more of a voice with city policies.


With the support of the entire community, Clarence Albrecht became the first mayor of Live Oak. The first official city

meetings would be held in the Albrecht's back yard under a beautiful cluster of Live



During the city's 60 years of incorporation there would be many more men and women that would serve as mayor of Live Oak. We would like to celebrate the Mayors past and present for their service and leadership to the community; John L. Harper (1972-1976), Frank Willson (1976-1982), Ralph E. Cullip (1982-1986), Normand R. Tremblay (1986-1992), Ray Hildebrand (1992-1996), Paula Stakes (1996-2000), Henry O. Edwards, Jr. (2000-2008), Joseph W. Painter (2008-2010), and Mary M. Dennis 2010 to present.

Historical Moments & Early Businesses



Throughout the city's history, there were historical moments and iconic sites that adorned the streets and major business areas. In the Pat Booker Road area near what is now Kobe Teppan & Sushi restaurant stood Herman's Dance Hall & Bar. A local business man and his wife opened the venue as one of the first businesses in Live Oak to lure people to the area. Patrons were entertained outside the

hall by Herman doing a high-wire routine between two poles approximately 15 feet off the ground. On Friday and Saturday nights, Herman's Dance Hall hosted local musical talents like Adolph Hopner's Band out of New Braunfels to provide entertaining dance music. Live Oak's Herman's Dance Hall was the place to go and let your hair down for many years.

In the late 1950's and early 1960's a local businessman named Jimmy Johnson built a speedway on Austin Highway to race midget cars. Edgar Bowles, having recently completed his service with the U.S. military, leased the track from Mr. Johnson and operate the races at the property. Once the raceway became popular with race goers, Edgar began looking for property to build a new raceway and provide adequate parking for the racing crowds. Edgar eventually purchased property off of Toepperwein Road for \$52,500.00 and construction began soon after.

There were hurdles that Edgar would have to overcome during the construction of the racetrack.

Quincy Lee, who was a San Antonio resident living off of Toepperwein across from the site filed a lawsuit in Bexar County District Court to halt the construction.

Quincy cited that the decibel level of noise due to the construction was a public nuisance. Edgar hired Dayton Wally, who was a prestigious attorney in San Antonio, to represent him. The lawsuit at the time was a landmark case for noise disturbances, and the presiding judge would eventually rule that the construction could continue.

In 1968, Edgar was approached by local businessman Red McCombs who had property east of the track that he was willing to swap. Edgar swapped the track for 33 acres which fronted

Another notable business in Live Oak that should be recognized was the Judson Four Drive-in that opened in April 1977




at the corner of Toepperwein and IH-

35 North. The theater was owned and operated by Maurice Braha. Mr. Braha was born in Cairo, Egypt and worked as a translator for the British government during World War II. He immigrated to the United States in 1952 under the sponsorship of a British officer. The screens were smaller than most modern drive-ins, but the picture quality was great. Many classic movies like "Big Bad Mama" starring Angie Dickinson drew crowds of movie goers lined up all the way down the access road of IH 35. The Judson Four would be the last drive-in built in the San Antonio region and would also have the shortest life closing in the early 80's. When the drive-in closed it later became a One Hour Golf driving range.

Toepperwein Road, west of the original track. Red McCombs hired Ricky Ware to promote the track, and ran the track races until 1979. During the life of the raceway, Pan Am Raceway would see many racers come and go and some that became famous. A.J. Foyt raced on the track as a young man. He was so young that his date would have to sign A.J. in as a competitor. In addition to Foyt, John Marcum was another notable racer that spectators could watch at Live Oak's Pan Am Raceway.



The Legendary Donkey Lady

The legend of the Donkey Lady evolved over time from the 1960's until her death in the 1990's. Dorothy "Doc" Anderson, known to some as the "Donkey Lady" or the "Skunk Lady," was described as a petite, pale complexioned woman with long black hair and always wearing bright red lipstick. She lived in a house made of tin and plywood in the "Robards" area on O'Connor Road area on the eastern side of Weidner Road that was said to have no running water or electricity. People who knew Doc said she had aspirations of being an actress in Hollywood and wore the bright red lipstick to look like her favorite actresses, such as Dale Evans. Some say she knew Dale Evans and Roy Rogers and called them "friends." Some say that Doc and husband Oscar were extras who worked on the set of "Rawhide."

Her normal attire would consist of old ragged clothes and a sunbonnet. Doc was known to raise rare breeds of pink donkeys, Appaloosa horses, skunks and several other animals living on the property. In Doc's prime of her life, she ran a dude ranch called "Doc's Little Dude Ranch" in the 4800 Block of Fredricksburg Road during the 1950's. The dude ranch offered horse rides, wagon rides, trail rides and donkey rides to visitors. Their income would vary from week to week but mostly came from the dude ranch. Doc and Oscar would often go without food so they could feed their beloved animals.

BOYSVILLE - 1943 to Present

Many of the City's long-time residents will remember when Boysville was at the corner of IH 35 and Loop 1604 where now the IKEA stands. Boysville, nicknamed the "Home with a Heart for Homeless Boys" started in downtown San Antonio but was

As an eccentric animal lover, she was also known to rescue pesky skunks from underneath the surrounding neighbor's houses with her bare hands while avoiding getting sprayed, for a small fee.

It was said that the Donkey
Lady was especially scary for
the children. Legend has it that
children would dare each other
to ride their bikes past her house.
High school students would
tease and harass Doc and Oscar
by cutting the ropes on all the
donkeys and horses, and Doc
would have to retrieve them from
the woods in the middle of the

night. She loved her animals and they always came first.

While the Live Oak Donkey Lady is now gone, her legend lives on and has morphed, some believe, to join with the Helotes and South Side stories. Even though the Donkey Lady was a recluse after the death of Oscar, she seemed to have a simple life but with a sad ending. The best part of the Donkey Lady's story is her love story described to us while interviewing people that knew her and Oscar. The love Doc and Oscar had for each other was beautiful and genuine.

moved to Live Oak in 1953 to provide agriculture programs for the kids. The central figures of Boysville were Rev. Don Holiman and Marshall Crook. Both men were a huge part of the development plan for the facility and facilitators of moving the facility to the Live Oak area. Also, Jack Ridgeway was a local attorney who was instrumental in what Boysville has become

today. He was a major financial supporter and could be seen on campus attending every event and meeting. In the 80's land prices were sky high and Boysville sold the property in 1983 and relocated their campus to the current location on Loop 1604 in Converse.

While in Live Oak, Boysville had two large dormitories, a theater with a stage, several barns, and hosted famous celebrities such as Hop-along Cassidy and Jimmy Dean. The success of Boysville was always measured in terms of creating a family that was viable for the boys who didn't have families or a safe home. The campus was designed to help children in crisis who could not remain in their own home for a variety of reason. The campus provided family programs in parent education, medical services, shelter, and the basic necessities needed to make a child feel safe. Boysville has been very successful over the years with creating safe and nurturing environments that would produce boys and girls who would go on to be professional football players, tradesmen, college graduates, successful in business or on to serving our country in the military.

Throughout the history of Boysville, the main goal has always been to break the cycle of abuse or poverty and to return these children to their homes. Success would be measured in the children who would ultimately become capable of developing healthy lifestyles and teach them to become an active part of society. Today, Boysville has 10 homes that service children in

The small farming town that began with only 316 residents has now grown to an area approximately 5.5 square miles with an estimated population of approximately 18,800 by the new census results. Live Oak thrives by providing a varied array of business and service districts, educational facilities and state-of-the-art medical hospital and a medical hub that serves the Live Oak community and the entire northeast region. Today, Live Oak continues to provide a full range of the basic municipal services including public safety, residential solid waste sanitation services, water and wastewater services, public improvements, repair and maintenance of infrastructure,




recreational and community activities and general administrative services. The City also provides water service to most of the city, with the San Antonio Water System providing water service to the remaining portion of the city.

Fire Dept. Then and Now 60 Years Later

As the city celebrates the 60th year anniversary, we provide you with a glance at where it all began. The Live Oak Fire Department made its start as a volunteer fire department. Heinz Mueller became the first fire chief and led the original fire department efforts by using his home driveway to stage the first fire truck for ready response.

Through the years, more volunteers were added along with a lady's auxiliary to assist with fireground rehabilitation and fund raising. The first actual fire

station was located on Cherrywood Lane at the "Top of the Hill." Shortly after, the fire station was relocated to Shin Oak Drive in the building that is now the city council chambers.

In 2003, the current fire station was built on the corner of Shin Oak Drive and Oak Terrace. The new 27,000 sq. ft. facility accommodates the living quarters for the firefighters, administrative offices for fire personnel, Telecommunications and the building and inspections department.

The volunteer firefighters did not have much funding, so to raise money they worked as emergency response and rescue for the Pan Am Speedway that was located on Toepperwein Road near where the San Antonio Auto Auction is currently located today off of Toepperwein Road.



The dedicated volunteers had to do more with less, so they purchased old trucks and converted them into working fire and rescue vehicles. Many career firefighters and volunteers have graced the Live Oak Fire Department over the decades. This includes Brian Elbel, who became the second fire chief in 1989 after the retirement of Chief Heinz Mueller. At that time, the fire department had three shifts of three paid firefighters providing 24 hour coverage that was supplemented by volunteers.





When Brian Elbel retired in 2006, Charles Foster became the third fire chief. At that time, there were six career firefighters per shift and the volunteer component of the department slowly ended due to the vast changes in firefighting and regulatory requirements. Chief Foster retired in 2018 and Linc Surber became the fourth fire chief in the history of the Live Oak Fire Department. Today as we look back in time, we celebrate the great contributions of all those who served from the department's foundation to our current status as a modern professional fire department.

Celebrating Telecommunicators Week April 12th - 18th 2020

Every year during the second week of April, the Telecommunications personnel in the public safety community are honored. It is a week to celebrate those who serve the public with hard work and dedication to the community. This year National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week is April 12-18, 2020. Initially set up in 1981 by Patricia Anderson of the Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office in California. In 1994 Congress made the formal proclamation to recognize those that are the 1st first responders of every emergency call.

Live Oak Public Safety Communications dispatches for the City of Live Oak, Selma, and Judson ISD Police Department. There are currently 8 dispatchers and 2 Supervisors who work 12 hour shifts 6a-6p and 6p-6a.

In a once female dominant profession, there is a current shift in having more males working in emergency communications. Telecommunicators are licensed through the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. We currently have 3 Basic Telecommunicators, 3 Intermediate Telecommunicators, 3 Advanced Telecommunicators, and 1 Master Telecommunicator license holder who must complete continuing education to keep their licenses active. Telecommunicators are now recognized in the state of Texas as first responders just as Police, Fire, and EMS personnel.

We commend all the sacrifices our dispatchers make, working nights, weekends, holidays, long hours in a sometimes stressful environment. Their commitment to the profession and to the community is greatly appreciated. We intend to reward them for their service this week with a nice meal provided for our personnel, a themed decorated office, games and prizes.

Carbon Monoxide Awareness Program

Every year, over 20,000 people in the United States are sickened by accidental carbon monoxide poisoning and approximately 500 people die, many in their own home. With this in mind, it's important to make sure your family is protected. Carbon monoxide is called the silent killer because it is odorless, colorless and tasteless. Gas appliances, fireplaces and cars parked in attached garages present the highest risk for carbon monoxide poisoning.

The Live Oak Fire Department is creating the Kemeth Cole Mayfield carbon monoxide awareness program which provides carbon monoxide detectors for families that would not otherwise, be able to afford one. This program was started by the Mayfield family who lost their son, Kemeth Cole, an established physicist and engineer, to carbon monoxide poisoning in 2019. It is the hope of the Mayfield family to do what they can to help promote carbon monoxide poisoning awareness and just maybe save a life.

LOCAP was founded in 2009 by then Police Chief Ron Echols and members of prior graduating Citizens Police Academies. The first academy class was held in 2007. Sgt. Jesse Barela was the Police Liaison and advisor until 2019, when that job was passed to Sgt. Billy Feldtmose. Carol Hoke, one of the founding members, and a handful of other alumni, met with alumni organizations from the surrounding communities and set forth the bylaws. LOCAP officially became an organization soon after. Shortly thereafter, we were granted a 501c3 status. Carol is our "historian" and she can relay all sorts of stories from the "early days."

The purpose of LOCAP is to support and assist the Live Oak Police Department in any way we can. It may be by volunteering within the department itself, or by assisting in community events in which patrol officers may be better utilized by not being taken from their official duties to perform events which LOCAP members can carry out.

In order to be able to provide financial support, several fundraisers are held throughout the year and donations accepted from the community. LOCAP has purchased armored vests for two LOPD K9s, a ceremonial trumpet used during memorial services, gym equipment, and trading cards for the canines which are handed out by their handlers during community events and school visits, and we have also made large monetary contributions to the Junior Police Academy as well as to the Citizens Police Academy.






