# Hot Dogs Are Not Cool

## HEAT STROKE IN FAMILY PETS



The summer months are usually filled with outdoor fun in the sun for us humans. But when thinking of summer outdoor activities, we sometimes forget to think about the health and welfare of our pets left out exposed to the Texas heat. Statistics show that the summer months become busier for Animal Control officers with a growing number of calls about animals left out in the heat or worse, in a locked hot vehicle. We wanted to take this opportunity to remind everyone that similar to humans, it only takes a few minutes for animals to dehydrate or suffer a heat stroke. If you have an outdoor fur baby, please

remember to leave plenty of water and provide ample shade for them to cool off in while you are away. Be mindful of the asphalt and concrete temperatures during your strolls with your animals. You may not be affected but thermal contact burns from asphalt and concrete sidewalks can severely harm your pet's paws.

Exercise your pets early in the morning or late at night to make the walk more comfortable for both you and your fur baby. By providing these helpful tips on heat awareness together we will keep our Live Oak animals safe. Help us keep our animal rescue numbers low this summer!

### WHAT ARE THE SIGNS OF HEATSTROKE?

- Increased heart rate
- Excessive panting
- Increased salivation
- Bright red tongue
- Red or pale gums
- Thick, sticky saliva
- Depression
- Weakness
- Dizziness
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea

**AS HEATSTROKE PROGRESSES, IT CAN CAUSE SEIZURES, COMA & CARDIAC ARREST**

### What **NOT** to do on **HOT DAYS**

**DON'T** leave pet in your car, even if it's in the shade!

**DON'T** forget to provide large amounts of water

**DON'T** allow pet to exercise excessively.

### What **TO DO** on **HOT DAYS**

Keep your pet inside.

Make sure pet has a shady to area to escape to.

Ask a neighbor to check on pet.

Make sure pet has LOTS of water.

Add ice cubes to water.

Repeatedly wet dog with hose if panting heavily.

### WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY DOG GETS HEATSTROKE?

Remove your dog from the hot area immediately. While transporting him to your veterinarian, lower his temperature by placing cool, wet towels over the back of the neck, under the forelimbs, and in the groin area. If possible, increase air movement around him with a fan. Be careful, however, as using very cold water can actually be counterproductive.

I am fully aware of risks and hazards connected with being on the premises and participating in the activities, and I am fully aware that there may be risks and hazards unknown to me connected with being on the premises and participating in the activities, and I hereby elect to voluntarily participate in the activities, to enter upon the designated premises and engage in activities knowing that conditions may be hazardous, or may become hazardous or dangerous to me. I voluntarily assume full responsibility for any risks or loss, property damage or personal injury, that may be sustained by me, or any loss or damage to property owned by me, as a result of my being a participant in the activities, whether caused by the negligent of releasees or otherwise. I further hereby agree to indemnify and save and hold harmless the releasees and each of them, from any loss, liability, damage or costs they may incur due to my participation in the activities, whether caused by the negligence of any or all of the releasees, or otherwise. ## Pedestrians and Cyclists

The City of Live Oak maintains a beautiful park system. It is used and enjoyed by not just Live Oak citizens, but people from the entire Metrocom area. One of the great features of the parks is a series of paved walking trails in the Woodcrest Park.

Designed primarily for walkers, bicyclist also may use the trails. If you are not paying attention, this can cause a problem and injuries can occur. Texas law allows for bicycles to be ridden on sidewalks, however only when it is deemed safe to pedestrian traffic. Pedestrians and cyclists need to look out for each other. Cyclists, if you see a pedestrian on the trail or sidewalk, please slow down, let them know you are near and safely go around them. Pedestrians, if you see a cyclist please move over to one side and let them pass safely.

Remember, you are all there to enjoy, not run a race. Courtesy, consideration for safety of others and cooperation go a long way. Treat others as you wish to be treated. Also remember the City Code of Ordinances 16-43 prohibits motorized vehicles, other than maintenance or emergency vehicles from operating in city parks except in designated parking areas and paved roads. This does not include the paved walking/biking trails. During the summer months there are numerous people out enjoying activities in the parks. Have care and concern for each other and enjoy the outdoors. As you enjoy your walks and bicycle rides remember the old Irish Blessing, "May the road rise up to meet you, may the wind always be at your back and may the sun shine warm upon your face."

## K9 Warrant Needs a Vest

Members of LOCAP, Live Oak Citizens Assisting Police, are accepting donations toward outfitting LOPD K9, Warrant. Our new K9, Warrant, has recently come onboard. He has completed rigorous training with Officer David Wall, and is ready to officially go on duty. To do so, he needs a fitted armored vest, plus other items, such as an official collar, leashes and chew toys. A light-weight armored vest will be custom-fitted to Warrant. He must be able to support and accept the vest, and not be hindered by it while wearing it. Swimming is a great way to exercise and to have fun during the hot Texas summer. However, it can be dangerous without the proper safety rules in place. According to statistics, drowning is the second leading cause of death in children from ages 1 to 14. With the swimming season in full swing, we urge our residents to safety proof their pools.



Remember, the City of Live Oak requires a permit before constructing a pool in your backyard if the depth exceeds 24 inches. Please make safety...your number one priority when considering a pool or maintaining the pool you may already. Here's hoping you and your family have a wonderful and safe summer.

# POOL SAFETY

- 1. Pool Enclosures** - The Texas Health and Safety Code stipulates the property owner must have their pool area completely enclosed to a height of at least 48 inches. The state's Local Government Code allows municipalities to enact ordinances requiring minimum standards for pool fences and enclosures. (If you have a wooden privacy fence with a self-closing latch, it is sufficient) The municipality may require property owners to repair or replace any section of the pool enclosure that violates the minimum standards or the self-closing latch has defects.
- 2. Safety Equipment to be considered** - A safety pool cover. Install proper Virginia Graeme Baker drain covers. Never swim if drain covers are missing or broken.
- 3. Gates** - A gate with direct access to the swimming pool or spa that is equipped with a self-closing, self-latching device.
- 4. Doors** - Any door with direct access to the swimming pool or spa that is equipped with an audible alert device or alarm which sounds when the door is opened.
- 5. Safety First** - Never swim alone. Don't let children swim without adult supervision.



# Outdoor Water Saving Tips To Help Lower Your Bill

1. Water only when needed. Feel the soil, or use a soil moisture meter to determine when to water.
2. Do not over-water. As a general rule, three-fourths of an inch of water per week on St. Augustine or Zoysia grasses that are in full sun is sufficient for the summer. In the shade, it only needs one-half of an inch of water per week.
3. Water lawns early in the morning during the hotter summer months. Otherwise, much of the water used can simply evaporate. Watering by hand-held hose or with a 5-gallon bucket is allowed any time, but water waste is prohibited at all times. Water waste occurs when: watering outside of approved time periods and allowing water to run onto the pavement.



4. To avoid excessive evaporation, use a sprinkler that produces large drops of water, rather than a fine mist. Sprinklers that send droplets out on a low angle also help control evaporation.
5. Set automatic sprinkler systems to provide thorough but infrequent watering. Rain shut-off devices can prevent watering in the rain.
6. Use drip-irrigation systems for bedded plants, trees and shrubs, or turn the flat, green soaking hoses upside down so the holes are on the bottom. This will help prevent evaporation.
7. Be careful not to water the streets, sidewalks or driveways.

## REDUCE Storm Water Pollution



### Everyone can help to reduce pollution levels in our creeks and streams. Here's some tips you can use for Lawn Care.

1. Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.
2. Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
3. Compost or mulch yard waste. Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams.



## Don't Let Oak Wilt Kill Kill Live Oak Trees

**PAINT** all wounds to the trunk, limbs and root system of oak trees that expose sapwood within thirty minutes of the wound with asphaltic or exterior oil or latex based paint.

# eCycle and Hazardous Waste Removal

There is an easy way to recycle responsibly.

The electronics recycling world is feeling the impact of supply and demand. It is becoming increasingly difficult to secure a vendor that can responsibly recycle e-waste without passing the fee onto the consumer. The city recognizes this issue and would like to introduce an even easier way to rid yourself of e-waste and other hazardous materials from your home.

[Waste Management's At Your Door Special Collection](#) provides residents with a service to remove the difficult, sometimes hazardous and hard-to-recycle items that almost every household accumulates. These materials include automotive products, home cleaners, garden chemicals, electronics, paint products and universal materials. Waste Management makes it easy for residents to dispose of these items, by collecting the materials at their door— safely, easily and responsibly at no cost. Televisions, computers and other hazardous materials should never be placed in the garbage. They contain harmful contaminants such as lead and mercury which make their way into our soil and waterways. As a matter of information, Texas House Bill 2714 is an act relating to programs for the recycling of computers equipment of consumers of the state of Texas and also providing penalties for not doing so responsibly.

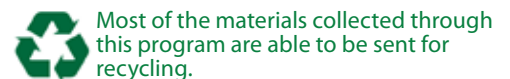
## How does this service work?

2. A Collection Kit with instructions will be mailed to your home.
3. Read the instructions carefully, there are some items unable to be collected.
4. On the day of your collection, place the Collection Bag near your front door or other area on your property that was discussed with the Waste Management representative. Then materials will be picked up at your home.
5. Materials are taken to a facility, then sorted and sent to be recycled and/or disposed of properly.

# Stay Safe Life-Saving Tips



**Whether camping, partying or just relaxing in your RV, fire safety is essential. Ensure your family's safety while travelling in your RV by following these fire safety guidelines.**

1. Please make sure we can find you – **SECONDS COUNT!** It's crucial to know your location so emergency responders can find you.
2. Confirm the local emergency numbers for police, fire and ambulance – **is 911 Service available in the area?**
3. Most campgrounds are in remote areas that may not provide cell phone coverage. **Check your coverage.**
4. When vacationing in an isolated area, keep in mind that emergency services may be some distance away. Eliminate risk from fire with an **escape plan**. Have at least two escape routes – one in the front and one in the rear of the RV.
5. The first rule of RV firefighting is to **save lives first and property second**. Get yourself and your family to safety before attempting to extinguish any fire -- **GET OUT & STAY OUT!**
6. Install and maintain **at least one smoke alarm** in your RV near the sleeping area. Special 12v smoke alarms, designed for RVs, are available from specialized retailers. More than one smoke alarm may be required.
7. Install and maintain **at least one carbon monoxide alarm** in your RV near the sleeping area. Special 12v carbon monoxide alarms, designed for RVs, are available from specialized retailers. Residential style alarms may only sound an alarm when your RV is plugged into an electrical source but won't function when you're on the road or operating off of your 12v battery supply.
8. Install a fully charged **multi-purpose or ABC fire extinguisher** in a visible, easily accessible location near an exit where escape is also an option. Make sure everyone knows where it is and how to use it. Check the pressure gauge to ensure it's fully charged, indicated by the needle in the green area.
9. Remember, **DON'T FIGHT A FIRE** unless you call the fire department first! A fire extinguisher is no substitute for the fire department.
10. Ensure the **extension cord** for connecting your RV to a 110v electricity supply is in **good condition** and of suitable gauge wire to handle the electrical load placed upon it.
11. Check all **electrical appliances for frayed cords** and any other visible damage.
12. Electrical generators produce exhaust gasses, which contain carbon monoxide. It is important to have the **exhaust pipes extend sufficiently past the side walls or rear of the RV** so that prevailing air currents can disperse this lethal gas away from the vehicle and not have it drawn back into an open window on the RV.
