Dear Resident's ,

The City of Live Oak has kicked off 2023 running full speed ahead. On December 13th, the Live Oak Economic Development Corporation (EDC) wrapped up the year by voting to approve funds for seven major projects that will lead to substantial economic benefits in the areas of the Town Center, Toepperwein Road, and City parks for a combined total of \$1,375,000. In January 2023, City Council approved all proposed projects that included park trails, playground-equipment replacement, park maintenance and replanting of trees, and a waterline extension for future businesses on Toepperwein Road. The trail and waterline extension projects align with the City's Comprehensive Plan and a citywide initiative to provide park trail connectivity in key areas throughout Live Oak.

In 2021/2022, the EDC funded \$200,000 along with the City's contribution towards the replacement of the old "Barney" playground equipment. In December 2022, the installation of the new playground equipment was completed and was renamed as "Acorn Playground." The EDC Board agreed to provide \$300,000 in additional funding to support the replacement of the aging playground equipment at the Hilltop Playground in the Main City Park. Replacement of the Hilltop equipment near the round pavilion is funded in the current 2022/2023 fiscal year budget for \$500,000. The total cost of this playground equipment is \$800,000 and will be designed to complement the theme of the Acorn Playground but on a grander scale. The Inclusive for children of all abilities, the new playground will be physically challenging to promote fitness, and will showcase the natural beauty of the park.



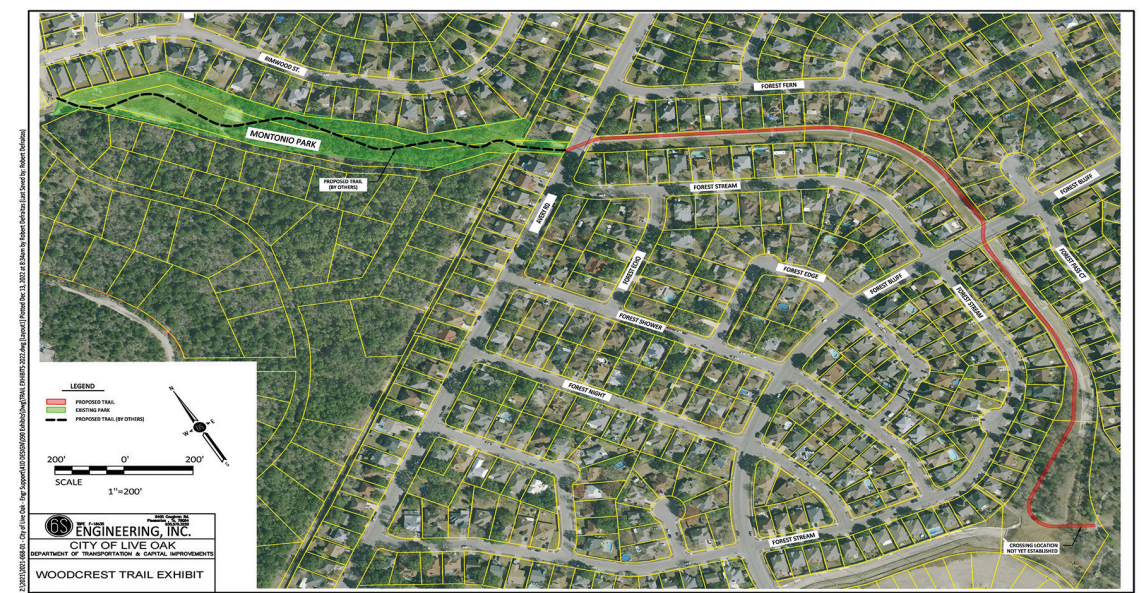
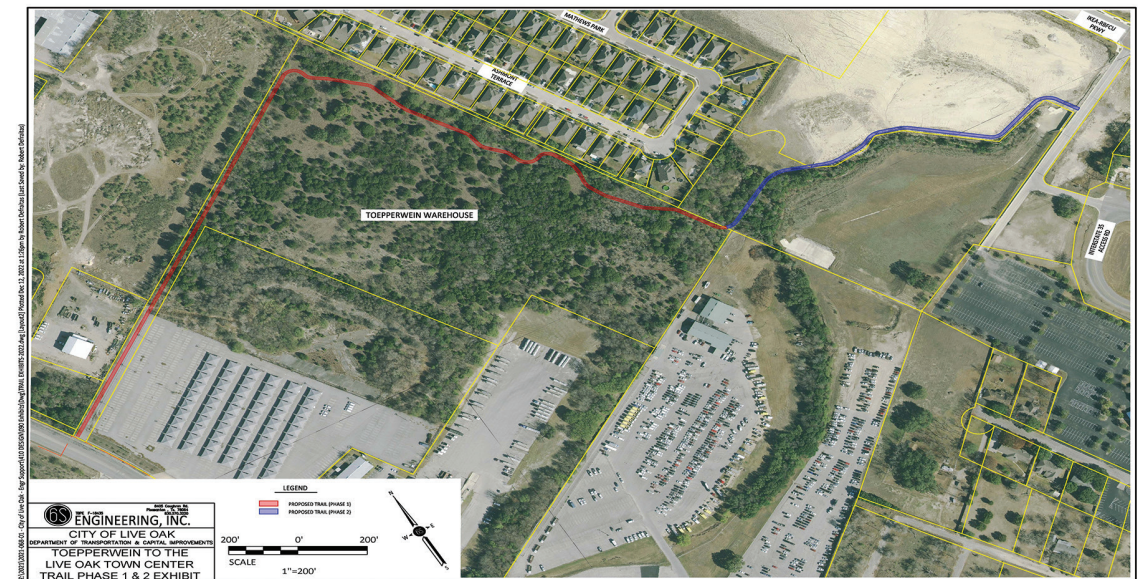

The city has an opportunity to connect Toepperwein Road to the Live Oak Town Center with a new park trail. This trail will require two phases. Each phase will coincide with the timing of the adjacent commercial business development and may take 2 to 3 years to complete. Phase I will probably run a year or more ahead of Phase II. The developer of the Toepperwein Warehouse Project and Live Oak Town Center is willing to provide the land necessary for the trail project, and the EDC will provide funds not to exceed \$300,000 for the construction.

Live Oak staff will collaborate with the engineers and coordinate with the developers to convey the land and synchronize construction with the development of the Town Center. Phase II will pick up at the end of the trail from Phase I and will continue into the Town Center, connecting near Twin Peaks. Phase II has an associated cost not to exceed \$200,000 from the EDC fund.



Lastly, we will take advantage of an existing City greenbelt drainage right-of-way to connect residents to Woodcrest Park. The trail will begin on Avery Road, cross Forest Bluff, and tie into the existing trail at Woodcrest Park. The new Woodcrest trail will improve the quality of life, expand the trail system, and connect residents to recreational opportunities. Trails always score high on park and recreation surveys by residents. The EDC will fund a total of \$400,000 for the Woodcrest Park Trail.

A big thanks to the EDC Board and the Parks and Recreation Commission for their diligent work in keeping our park system a place where residents and visitors want to play. 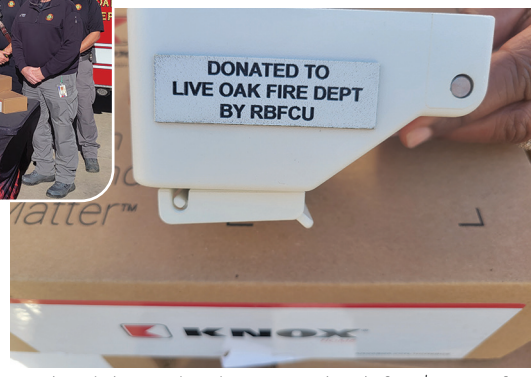

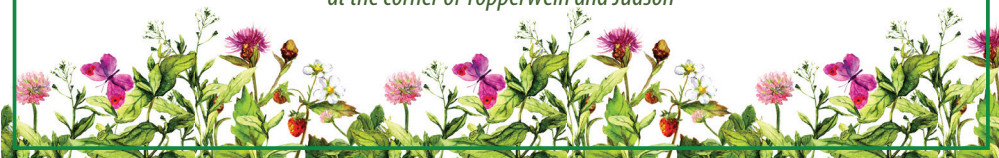

What we're up to?

Greetings Friends and Family of Live Oak,

It is always our pleasure to write to you and let you know how your police department is doing. Live Oak Police Department is going through the re-accreditation process to remain a recognized law enforcement agency in the state of Texas. There are approximately 2,750 of law enforcement agencies statewide but of that 2,750, roughly 300 are accredited agencies in Texas. Live Oak is in that top 10 percent of recognized agencies.

Live Oak is doing well. We have been targeting vehicle burglaries and catalytic converter thefts since October 2022. We are proud to have seen a decrease in vehicle burglaries and a significant drop in catalytic converter thefts. However, we must remain vigilant to sustain this level of security for our neighborhoods and communities. We still need your help.

One of the scarier crimes noted has been the increase in deadly conduct incidents. Deadly Conduct, as per § 22.05 of the Texas Penal Code, occurs when a person recklessly engages in conduct that places another in imminent danger of serious bodily injury. Deadly conduct incidents have been on the rise with road rage incidents not only in Live Oak, but throughout the State of Texas. In December 2022 there was a shooting associated with road rage on Oak Meadows. Fortunately, there were no injuries. We encourage residents to report any dangerous or reckless activity, especially involving firearms, to the police as soon as possible.



April is Child Abuse Prevention Month (CAPM), and we want your help to empower communities with resources to support Texas children, youth, and families where they live, learn, work, and play.

For the month of April, we encourage you to promote child abuse prevention awareness with your networks by decorating and displaying your Cardboard Kids®.

In 2014, ChildSafe created Cardboard Kids, a city-wide public awareness campaign to draw attention to the pervasiveness of child abuse and the fact that every story is different and every child unique. Cardboard Kids will begin distribution in March. They will be decorated and placed all over San Antonio on "Reveal Day," in early April. Cardboard Kids social media campaigns, volunteers, and community partners like YOU guarantee a greater awareness of the problem of child abuse.



Junior Police Academy:

In March, we will begin accepting Junior Police Academy Applications to The Live Oak Junior Police Academy is held in June. Cadets attending the academy will experience various fields of police work. The cadets start the week by going through an obstacle course that is part of the police departments hiring process. Cadets also receive firsthand training in crime scene investigation and lifting latent fingerprints.



Spring Break Safety Tips

Make a Game Plan

If you are planning to take a trip this spring break, devise a game plan with everyone involved. In addition to discussing the details beforehand, make sure everyone has a travel itinerary, a list of phone numbers, and an assigned friend to keep track of throughout the trip.

Travel Smart

A safe arrival to your destination is essential to having a great trip for the whole family. If you will be traveling by car, make sure your vehicle is ready to hit road by checking the tires, keeping a full tank of gas, and building an emergency survival kit. If you will be flying, pack a healthy snack and comfortable shoes and don't forget to stretch your arms and legs between flights. Compression stockings or socks are a great alternative for a long flight.

Talk About Stranger Danger

Especially if you will be traveling to a new and unfamiliar location, talking to your kids about potential stranger danger is one of the most important steps you can take to ensure a safe vacation. Teach your children to never to talk with strangers, particularly at night, and to report any suspicious behaviors to an adult.

Have a Medical Emergency Plan

Hopefully, this spring break will be a safe one for the entire family. However, in the event of an accident, illness, or injury, it is important to devise an emergency plan beforehand to ensure you have access to the right form of medical care.

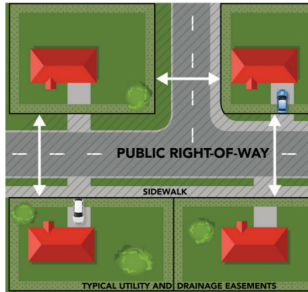
Citywide Garage Sales: April 28th, 29th and 30th
Bulk Pick Up Begins: May 1st at 6 a.m.

BARGAIN HUNTERS! MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR April 28, 29 and 30, 2023

No Garage Sale permits are required in the city limits of Live Oak. Participating residents may email Cathi at cpiotrowski@liveoaktx.net or call 210-653-9140, ext. 2234 by 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, April 26th; to place your items and information on city’s website and the City’s Facebook page.

Information needed:

1) Street address, 2) Date(s), 3) Hours, and 4) Main Items for Sale (i.e., TV, Children’s Toys, Dresser, etc.). Signs can be placed in your yard or a neighbor’s yard with their permission, but not in the city rights-of-way. Signs cannot be placed against the curb or cannot be placed on the street side of the sidewalk (see diagram). All signs must be removed no later than 24 hours after your garage sale ends.



Bulk Pick Up is now the first Monday of every month. Large items not sold at the April garage sales can be placed at the curb for the beginning of Bulk collection by Sunday, April 30th. Bulk Pick Up is Citywide and can take up to two weeks to complete. Items cannot be placed at the curb before Wednesday, April 26th.

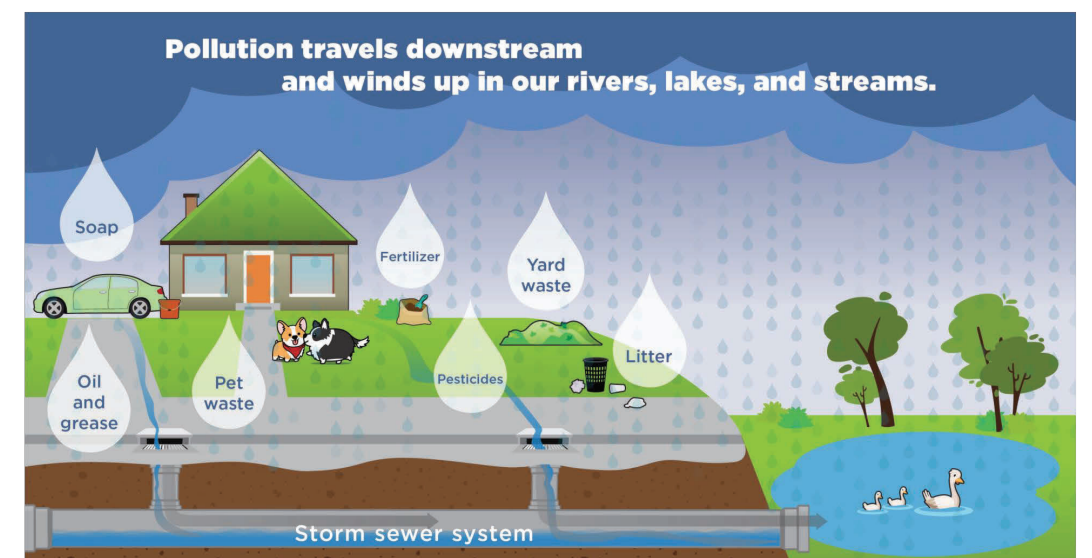
- Examples of acceptable bulk items include chairs, sofas, mattresses, tables, emptied water heaters, and lawn furniture.
- **The following items are unacceptable and will not be collected. No televisions, No computers, No monitors, No refrigerators, No window units, No portable air conditioners or anything that contains Freon, No tires, No batteries, No glass, No Household Hazardous Waste** (see below for collection).
- Waste Management will only pass by once. Please remember not to cover the sidewalk or water meter with your items, and **do not park along the curb near the bulk items.**

Have you ever watched water run down a gutter or pool on the side of the road during a storm? What happens to all the water? Most stormwater—the water from rain and snow—runs over the land and down a storm drain. The water flows through a network of underground pipes and open channels directly to our streams, rivers, and lakes. That’s why keeping stormwater clean is vital to the health of our waterways, community, and even our economy.

KNOW WHAT’S IN THE FLOW

When water flows off our property after a storm, what’s on our lawns, roads, buildings, and parking lots flows with it. The water that doesn’t soak into the ground picks up oil, litter, fertilizer, and other unhealthy items along its way that wind up in our rivers, lakes, and streams.

Water pollution can start on your property in ways you cannot see, but that affect your health and the whole community downstream. Watching what we put in our storm drains and



on our property makes our rivers, lakes, and streams cleaner, healthier, and more enjoyable. And by investing in solutions to manage stormwater, we help make our community a safer, greener, healthier, and more enjoyable place to live.

Stormwater is the water that flows over the ground after it rains, snows, or sleet. It can become polluted as it runs over hard surfaces and flows downstream.

Preparation

Now that we are out of the winter months, it's time for spring cleaning. But have you thought of what could happen when we experience heavy rainfall? We are starting to enter in the rainiest months of the year. Are you prepared?

Make a plan for your household, including your pets, so you and your family know what to do, where to go, and what you will need to protect yourselves from flood waters. Learn and practice evacuation routes, shelter plans, and flash-flood response. Gather supplies, including non-perishable foods, cleaning supplies, and water for several days, in case you must leave immediately or if services are cut off in your area.

Prepare Your Pets for Disasters

Your pets are important member of your family! This is why they should be included in your family's emergency plan.

- To prepare for the unexpected, keep your pets in mind as you follow these tips:
1. Make a plan.
 2. Build an emergency kit.
 3. Stay informed.

Make a Plan
If you have a plan in place for you and your pets, you will likely encounter less difficulty, stress and worry when you need to make a decision during an emergency.

- THINGS TO INCLUDE IN YOUR PLAN:**
- **Know what to do with your pet during an evacuation.** Many public shelters and hotels do not allow pets inside. Know a safe place where you can take your pets before disasters and emergencies happen.
 - **Develop a buddy system.** Plan with neighbors, friends or relatives to make sure that someone is available to care for or evacuate your pets if you are unable to do so.
 - **Have copies of your pet's vaccination record, and make sure your pet is microchipped.** Keep your address and phone number up-to-date and include an emergency contact outside of your immediate area.
 - **Keep contact information for your local emergency management office or animal control office and shelters** on hand in case you become separated from your pet.

Build a Kit for your Pet
Just as you do with your family's emergency supply kit, think first about the basics for survival.
Review your kit regularly to ensure that their contents are fresh.

- HERE ARE SOME ITEMS TO INCLUDE IN AN EMERGENCY KIT FOR YOUR PET:**
- **Food and Water.** Keep several days' supply of both.
 - **Keep food in an airtight, waterproof container, and have a water bowl to use.**

- **Medicine.** Keep an extra supply of the medicine your pet takes on a regular basis in a waterproof container.
- **First aid kit.** Include items appropriate for your pet's emergency medical needs.
- **Backup collar with ID tag and a harness or leash.** Have copies of your pet's registration information in a waterproof container and available electronically.
- **Traveling bag, crate or sturdy carrier** for each pet.
- **Grooming Items.** Pet shampoo and other items, in case your pet needs some cleaning up.
- **A picture of you and your pet together.** If you become separated from your pet, a picture will help you document ownership and allow others to assist you in identifying your pet.
- **Sanitation needs.** Include pet litter and litter box, trash bags and other items to provide for your pet's sanitation needs.
- **Familiar items.** Put favorite toys, treats or bedding in your kit to reduce stress for your pets.

Stay Informed
Stay informed of current conditions and know how you will receive emergency alerts and warnings.
Download the FEMA app to get weather alerts for up to five different locations anywhere in the United States.
Always bring your pets indoors at the first sign or warning of a storm. For more information about how to prepare your pets, visit Ready.gov/pets.

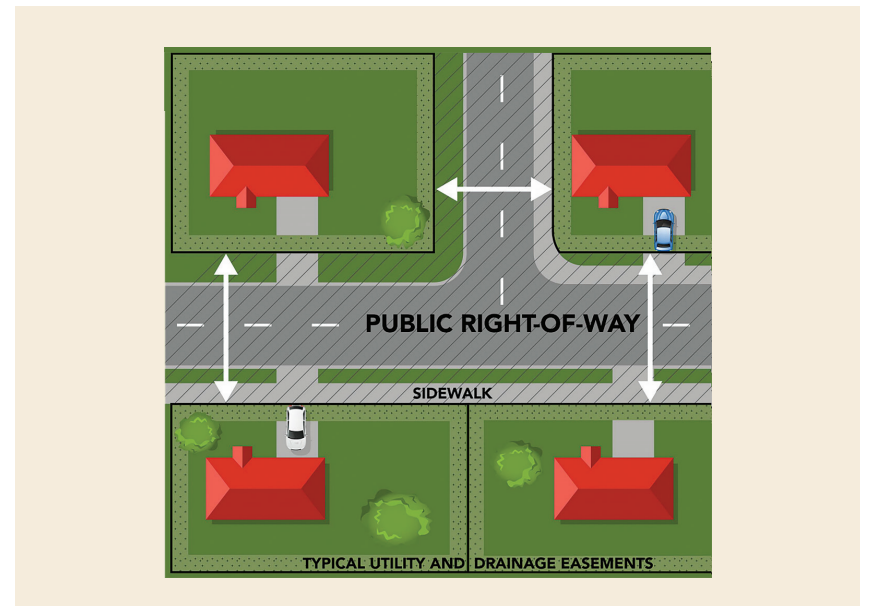
Bandit Sign Enforcement

You may ask yourself...Are bandit signs illegal when they are posted at an intersection, off-ramps of the highway, on private property without permission, and in the rights-of-way?

Bandit sign laws can vary by municipality. Bandit signs in Live Oak are regulated under Section 24-81 (Prohibited Signs) of the local Zoning Code. This code, along with all Live Oak's codes can be found on the City's website under the "Government" tab by clicking "Code of Ordinances."

Here are frequently asked questions regarding garage sale signs and other types of bandit signs.

- Q:** What is a bandit sign?
A: A bandit sign is any sign illegally placed in a restricted area, often advertising anything from rental homes to garage sales.
- Q:** What is the Right-of-Way?
A: Please see our Right-of-Way exhibit below.
- Q:** Where can I legally place signage?
A: Legal signage includes any signs placed on private property and not in the right-of way.
- Q:** Is it possible to obtain a permit to place signage in non-private areas?
A: Currently, the City of Live Oak does not issue any permits which allow citizens to post signage in any public or otherwise restricted areas.
- Q:** Does the content play a part in where a sign can go?
A: No signage is allowed in the Right-of-Way.
- Q:** What are the consequences for posting bandit signage?
A: Code Enforcement Officers will remove bandit signage.

- Route "A" is Wed/Sat trash routes.
- Route "B" is Mon/Thu trash routes.

Observed holidays: No collection on Thanksgiving, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. If your regular collection falls on one of these observed holidays, your collection will be delayed by one day for that week only. Observed holidays are highlighted in BLUE.

BRUSH & BULK COLLECTION Brush & Bulk

Citywide curbside brush and bulk collection begins during the first full week of each month. Bulk and brush must be out at the curb prior to Monday.

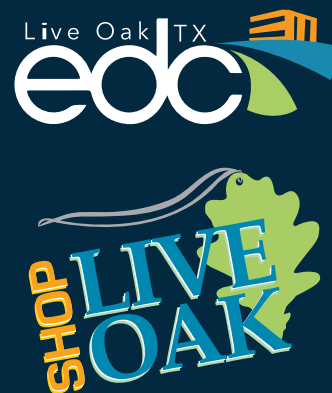

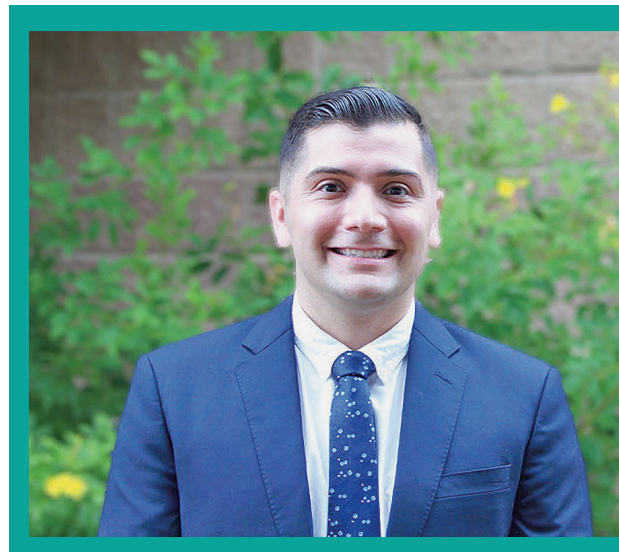

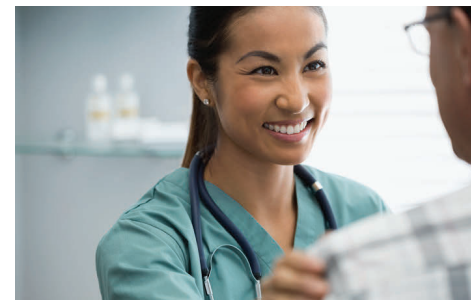
