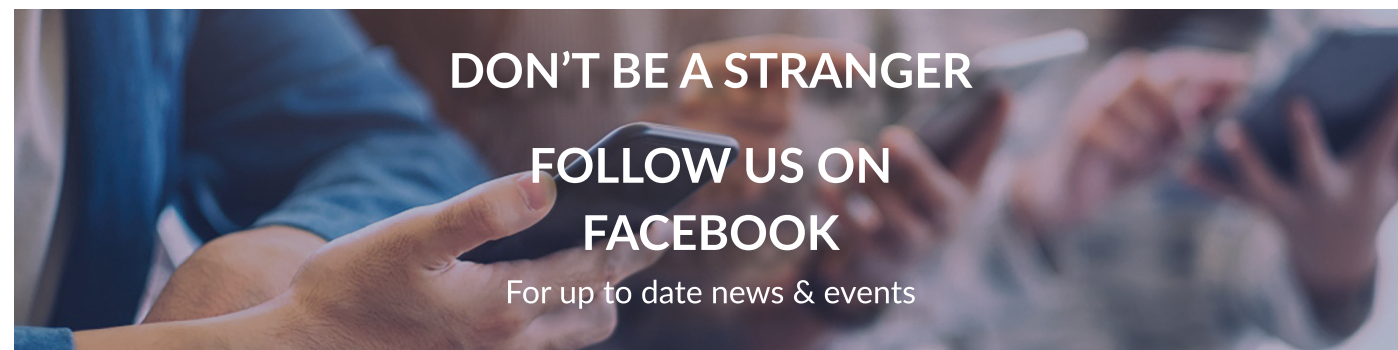

THE YEAR AT A GLANCE

Year 2022 was very prosperous for the City of Live Oak! The year began with the retirement of long-time employee and City Manager Scott Wayman after 35 years of service. In February, City Council welcomed Glen Martel as the new City Manager. Soon after, Anas Garfaoui joined the City as the Assistant City Manager. The new leadership team began the undertaking of the Subdivision and Zoning Ordinance rewrite. Many of the ordinance sections were in need of updating, with new state legislation dictating many of the remaining changes.

On May 7th, during the special election, your voice was heard with the passing of the \$18,000,000 Street Bond for street improvements. Improvements will include repairs to streets, bridges, and sidewalks throughout the City. The streets to be repaired were based on final engineering analysis by categorizing the repairs as high priority arterial and collector streets; and residential streets. The repair techniques include point repairs (potholes), pavement reclamation, and complete reconstruction. During the street projects, you will be able to follow the progress with the newly launched interactive GIS system from the City's website. The system will provide you with updates on Capital Improvement projects, street closures during repairs, and will link you directly to the zoning map of the City's districts. All with a simple click of the mouse.

April marked the beginning of budget discussions both at staff level and Council. The combined 2023 annual budget for all funds total \$44,541,600, making it the largest budget passed in Live Oak's history. The reason for the increased budget is due to budgeting for the street projects under the \$18,000,000 bond issue. The city's tax rate will

remain at \$0.410220 per \$100 valuation in order to pay the required annual debt service on the new voter approved bond issue. This tax rate is quite lower than what was projected at the beginning of the bond election process. Because of best practices and hard work, Live Oak is in great financial shape. At the same time, we have been able to move projects along, creating a better quality of life for our residents and a safer city. These projects include the masonry wall abutting Toepperwein Road, which is 90% finished at this time, and the final phase will be completed in early 2023. The City's Main Park received an update with the arrival of new playground equipment. Other major projects in the budget include the replacement of all facility generators, replacing the pavilion at the Main City Park, adding additional walking trails, sewer line televising and repairs; and street improvement construction projects under the bond.

As your Mayor and City Council, we will continue to work diligently on projects and issues that matter to you. I'm confident Council and staff will continue Live Oak's path of success as the "premier city to live, learn, work, and play" in Texas. It's been an honor and privilege to serve you as Mayor and we look forward to 2023 being another premier year for the Live Oak community and the northeast region.

Here's wishing you a Happy Thanksgiving and a joyous Christmas holiday with your loved ones. Remember, the best is yet to come!

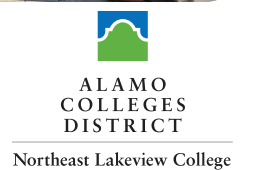
Restaurant Month Winner

Permitting Requirements

Did you know that all development within the city requires a permit? Always check and fulfill permitting requirements with the Development Services department at (210) 653-9140, extension 2244, before you build on, alter, fill, or re-grade on any portion of your property and/or within any easement or right-of-way. This construction or re-grading may alter the flow of water during a flood causing damage or backup to your home or your neighbor's home. Also, contact the number above to report any suspected permitting violations.

Help Us Prevent Flooding in Your Neighborhood



The City of Live Oak's Utility/Storm Water department performs cleaning and maintenance activities on the drainage channels and pipes in city easements & rights-of-way in accordance with an established schedule and other standard operating procedures. Residents are encouraged to assist in maintaining the drainage in their areas by removing or reporting obstructions (such as tree limbs, leaves, debris, trash, etc.). Keeping drainage channels free of obstructions reduces flooding in the event of heavy rains. By way of city ordinance, it is illegal to dump trash, leaves, landscape debris, paint, grease, or any other material into any portion of the city's drainage system. Such dumping can have devastating impacts on water quality in addition to causing flooding.

Even though many of us become very busy during this time, it is important to remember that the safety of your family and home are critical. If you are traveling, remember to have a friend or neighbor watch your home and pick up any newspapers or packages that have been delivered to your door. If possible, have interior lights on a timer to keep the appearance of activity in the home. Also, contact the Live Oak Police to place your home on the "Out of Town Watch" list.

While out shopping be aware of your surroundings. Watch for suspicious behavior or activity such as people who may be watching you leave your vehicle or a business, or someone looking into parked vehicles. Over the last 6 months, San Antonio and the surrounding cities have been

hit hard with vehicle burglaries. Be sure to secure your vehicle. Make sure your vehicle is locked and any valuables, bags or packages are out of sight. If you are out at night be sure to park your vehicle and walk in well-lit areas.

JULY is the annual BBQ cookout for our Live Oak Police family, friends and LOCAP members. This event is always a fan favorite, and this year was no exception.

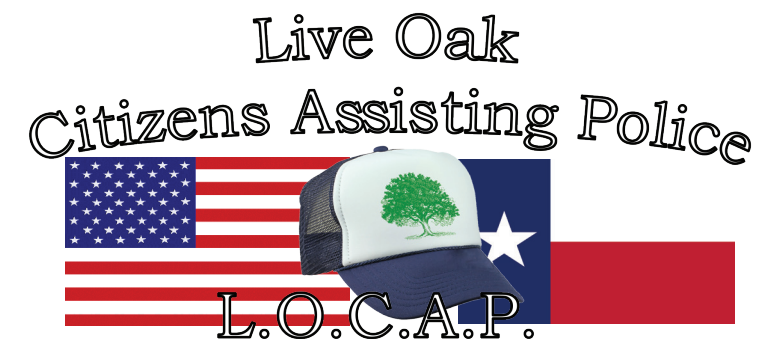

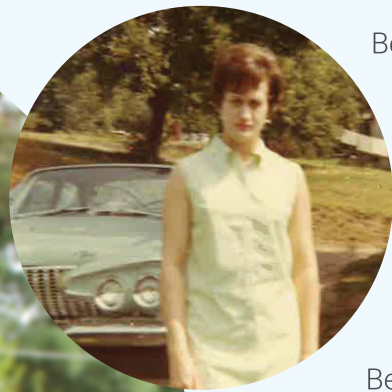
Honoring Our Local Veterans

Serving in America's armed forces is one of the most courageous and selfless decisions citizens of our country can make. It's a decision we should never cease to honor and celebrate. With that in mind, let us take a moment to honor all Veterans this Veterans Day by thanking them for their service. In this edition of the Hometown News, we honor and celebrate the service of one of our longtime residents, Robert "Bob" Smith.

Born and raised in Champaign/Urbana, Illinois, Bob joined the U.S. Navy in September of 1965 as a way of seeing the world. As a 3rd Class Petty Officer assigned as a Ship's Serviceman, Bob found himself on the longest commissioned attack aircraft carrier the USS Constellation (CVA-64). The USS Constellation was nicknamed "Connie" by naval officers and was later re-nicknamed "America's Flag Ship" by President Ronald Reagan. After nearly 42 years of commissioned service, the Constellation was decommissioned at Naval Air Station, North Island in San Diego on August 6, 2003. After many battles, she was towed to the inactive ship maintenance facility in Bremerton to await her final disposal on September 2003.

During Bob's military tour, he had the opportunity to visit Japan, Hawaii, the Philippines, Hong Kong, and would sail the waters of the South China Sea and the Gulf of Tonkin. He would see President Lyndon B. Johnson during a special visit to the Constellation in February 1968. 3rd Class Petty Officer Smith's duties were situated in the S3 Division which was responsible for supplies and accommodations such as laundry services, uniform purchase, and providing haircuts for Naval personnel. Before Bob went into the service, he worked as a barber at his Dad's barber shop called "Smitty's" in Illinois. So, working in the S3 Division was a perfect fit.

In his early years at the age of 12, Bob worked as a paperboy delivering newspapers and collecting the subscription fees from the neighborhood subscribers. While on one of his usual routes, Bob stopped to collect the newspaper fee from customer Betty Oakes. Like so many times before, he left his bike on the street while he conducted business. Ola Stitsel, Betty Oakes's younger sister who was visiting at the time, saw the bike laying in the street and decided to take it on a joy ride around the neighborhood. As would be expected, Bob was surprised to find his bike had been moved or taken. While Bob investigated the missing bike, Ola came back to the house riding his bike. After a brief introduction from Betty, he quickly asked Ola why she had taken his bike without permission. She replied "because I saw it and I wanted to take it for a ride." The chance encounter that day would change Bob's life forever. Ola, the same young girl that had stolen his bike would become his wife and true love many, many years later.



Before the proposal, and before the wedding, the girl that had taken his bike would grow up and eventually become Bob's pen pal. They exchanged many letters back and forth for months and the "girl" that stole his bike would eventually steal his heart. In 1966 while visiting the British Exchange in Hong Kong, Bob decided he was going to propose to Ola. He purchased a wedding ring and then informed Ola he had "purchased a ring that would fit her third finger on her left hand." The proposal wasn't very romantic nor conventional but Ola said "yes." Bob and Ola were married on December 13, 1967.

Before Bob ended his tour with the U.S. Navy in September 1969, he would receive several significant awards that included Navy Unit Commendation, Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal W/4 Bronze Stars, and a Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal W/Device. After fulfilling his obligation to the Navy, Bob would be considered inactive for two additional years with the possibility of being called back to serve.

Bob and Ola lived a quiet life together as a married couple in Urbana, Illinois until 2007. That was the year they decided to leave Illinois and move to Texas. The City of Live Oak has been the place they call home and where they have made many wonderful memories. This December 13th, Bob and Ola will celebrate their 55th wedding anniversary. To pass the time, Ola enjoys baking a variety of cookies and pans of delicious, rich fudge. Bob enjoys helping Ola deliver her sweet treats to neighbors and to city employees on special occasions. One of the couple's favorite things to do together is to drive the countryside. They have already planned future trips back home to visit family and friends in Illinois in 2023. Happy 55th Anniversary Bob and Ola and cheers to more happy moments together!

Live Oak, TX. - Plug Level I EV chargers directly into an outlet designed to handle the amperage of the charging device.

If your home has an interconnected smoke detection system, the Live Oak Fire Department will place a BATTERY smoke detector in the same area. 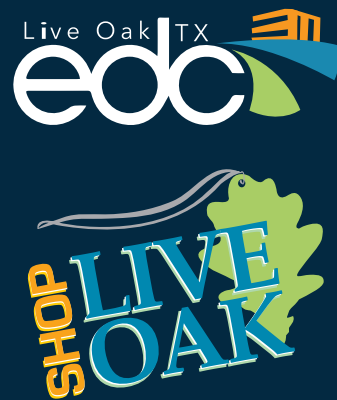

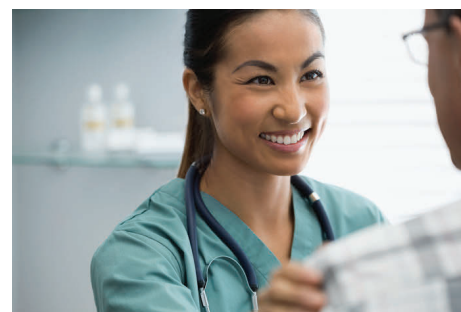
