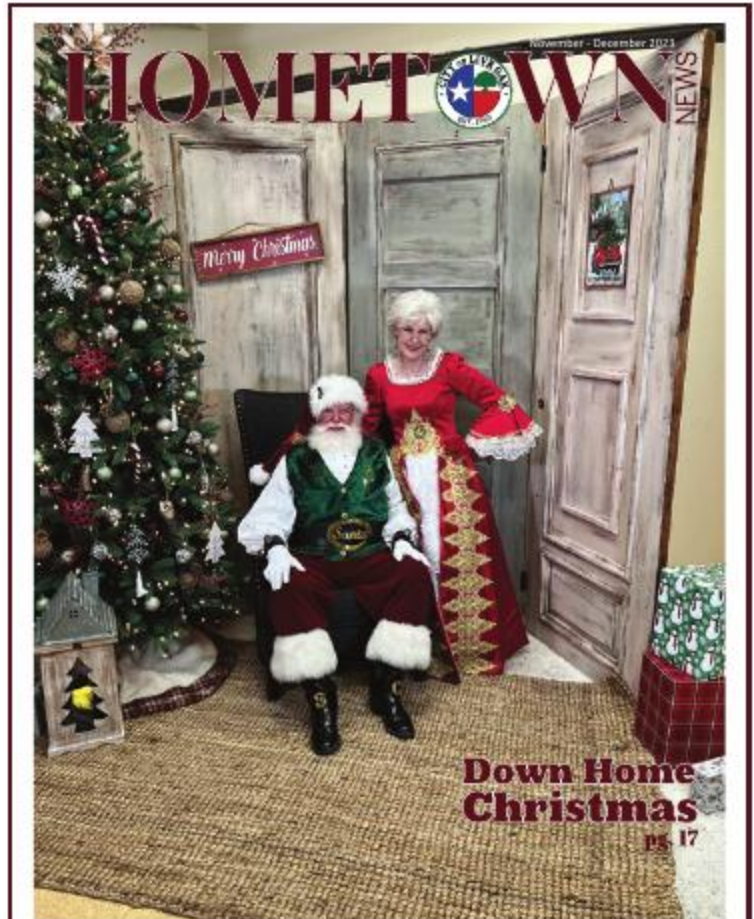

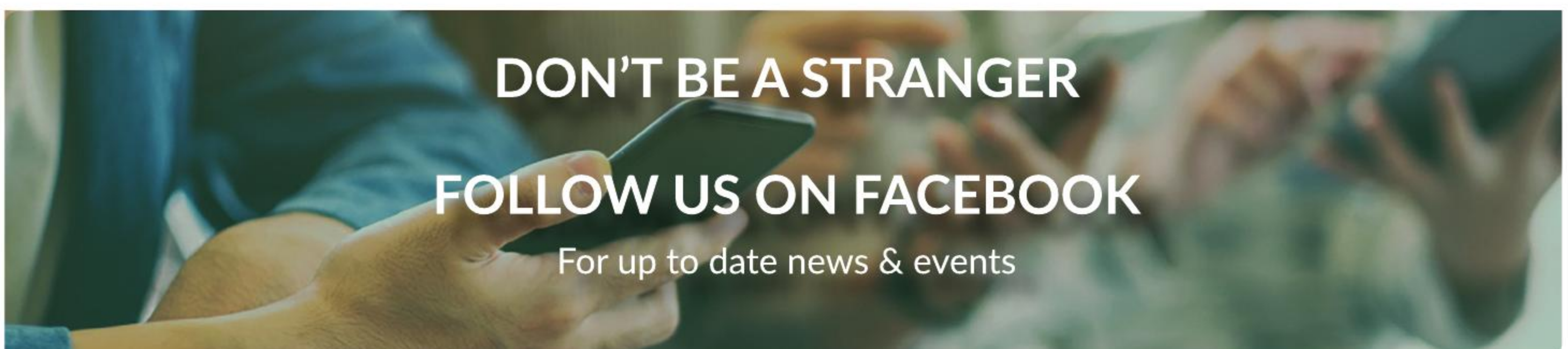

Concept to Reality, Live Oak is Moving Forward

Dear Residents,

Live Oak's Park system is known for its nature and culture connecting the community to its simplicity and beauty. The green spaces keep the public healthy, the wildlife preserved, supply a place for physical activity, and offer safe spaces for children and adults to play together. Its aesthetic value is a source of civic pride and vital to our community. There is still more work to be done by the implementation of innovative park projects designed to offer added amenities for residents and visitors to enjoy.

While there are certain common starting points for everyone, the route to get from an "idea" to a "park project" is unique and a process Live Oak will begin by developing a new Park Master Plan. Parks and recreation master planning is a comprehensive process that supplies guidance and policy direction. Typically, a Park Master Plan begins with engaging stakeholders, gathers public input, and provides a foundation to responding to the parks and recreation needs for the community. This planning process will allow Live Oak to examine its vision, existing services, facilities, and resources, and assess future park needs.

Over the past year, Live Oak's Economic Development Corporation (EDC) has bought 5.5 acres of green space, making Woodcrest Park a total of 45 acres which currently includes a playground and nature trails. The EDC also contributed and partnered with Parks & Recreation to add more trails connecting residents from Vista Ridge Subdivision with the Montanio Trail to Avery Road, Avery Road to Woodcrest Park, and a continuation of trails into the City's Main Park from the Clubhouse from Village Oak Drive to Shin Oak Drive. These added trails began construction during the Spring of 2023 and are slated to be completed in 2024 providing an unrivaled connectivity. Also, during 2022-2023, two playground upgrades were conducted in the Main City Park with the Acorn Playground and most recently added playland at the hilltop.

With the funding in place, the real work will begin. The first

step is to hire a professional consultant to begin developing the surveys for future public hearings to receive public input. Getting the public involved has always worked in our favor, so please watch for a series of upcoming public hearing dates on the City's website, local newspaper, and social media platforms. Over the estimated six-month process, the consultant will look at the more complex projects, review current facility conditions; spend an extended time looking at the parkland usage, topography, and vegetation; addressing accessibility; and mapping to decide both the existing and probable future locations of passive and active recreation sites.

During this time, the consultant will develop the conceptual design for the City Council and the Parks and Recreation Commission to review, adopt, and finally implement the new plan. Once the process is complete, the results for park improvement projects will be listed for public view on the City's website.

ARPA Success Story

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 delivered billions to small local governments across the State of Texas to support their response to and recovery from the COVID-19 public health emergency. The U.S. Treasury managed the distribution to these funds to eligible small counties and cities across Texas. The City of Live Oak was the recipient of \$4.1 million dollars for qualifying projects.

When the final results came out, smaller cities were given the ability to use their ARPA awards up to \$10 million under the category of "revenue loss" without going through any calculation. The City of Live Oak chose to use its \$4.1 million ARPA award through the category of "revenue loss" and use the money to offset payroll expenses for general services. By infusing the ARPA money into the General Fund to cover payroll expenses, it allowed the City to distribute other funds toward projects and equipment that may not have otherwise been funded.

These projects included: (1) a complete upgrade to all City generators used as backup power sources at Live Oak's water well sites and public facilities; (2) a sewer line televising and rehabilitation project(s); (3) an upgrade to the main park pavilion structure; (4) a new main park walking trail; and (4) a new playground equipment at one of the main park playgrounds. The ARPA funds enabled the City to quickly recover from revenue losses during the pandemic, mainly in sales taxes.

Receiving the ARPA funding placed the City of Live Oak in a position to begin work on the above-mentioned projects much sooner than expected. The projects will directly help the residents of Live Oak and allow the city to continue to be the premier community to live, learn, work, and play.

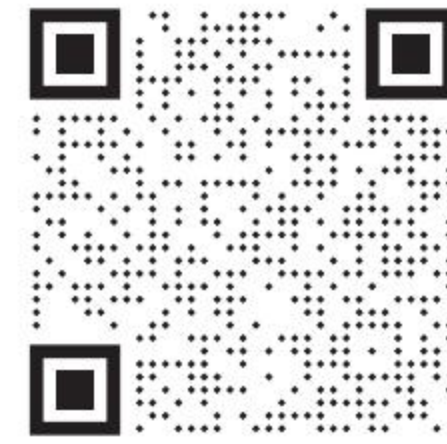

Protect Yourself with Flood Insurance

A few inches of rain can cause flooding conditions, and water inside a residential structure can easily cause tens of thousands of dollars in damage. Even though Live Oak has had only a few claims, if you experience any damage caused by water, flood insurance is the only way to protect yourself from devastating losses.

Flood insurance is available to homeowners, condo owners, commercial owners, and renters. The costs vary depending on how much insurance is purchased, what it covers, and the flood risk to the property.

All policies provide coverage for buildings and their contents. However, you might want to discuss insuring personal property with your agent, since contents coverage is optional. There is typically a 30-day waiting period from date of purchase before your policy goes into effect. So the sooner you act, the better.

Thank you for using the Single Use Disposal System!

The Single Use Disposal Systems (SUDS) are a convenient and environmentally friendly way to dispose of your unused or expired prescription medications. The pre-paid **TakeAway Envelope** allows you to mail your unused and expired prescriptions from the privacy of your own home. They are incinerated unopened keeping them out of our drinking water.

WHAT HAPPENS TO THE ENVELOPE AFTER IT IS MAILED?

The envelopes containing the medications are sent directly to a treatment facility to be incinerated.

ARE TAKEAWAY ENVELOPES SAFE?

Yes, the TakeAway Envelopes are safe. Using the TAE is safer than flushing or throwing the medications in the trash. Incinerating the medications limit the environmental damage that medications can have by preventing them from polluting our drinking water.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recommends incineration as the method of drug destruction, which meets the Department of Enforcement Agency's (DEA) standard.

CAN NEEDLES OR INHALERS GO IN THE ENVELOPE?

Unfortunately, no. Please reach out to your local health department.

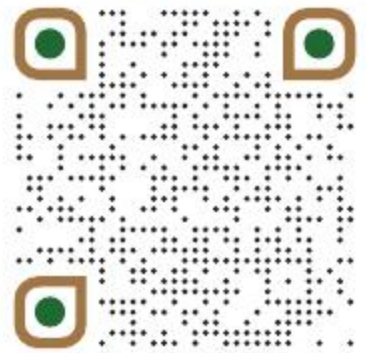

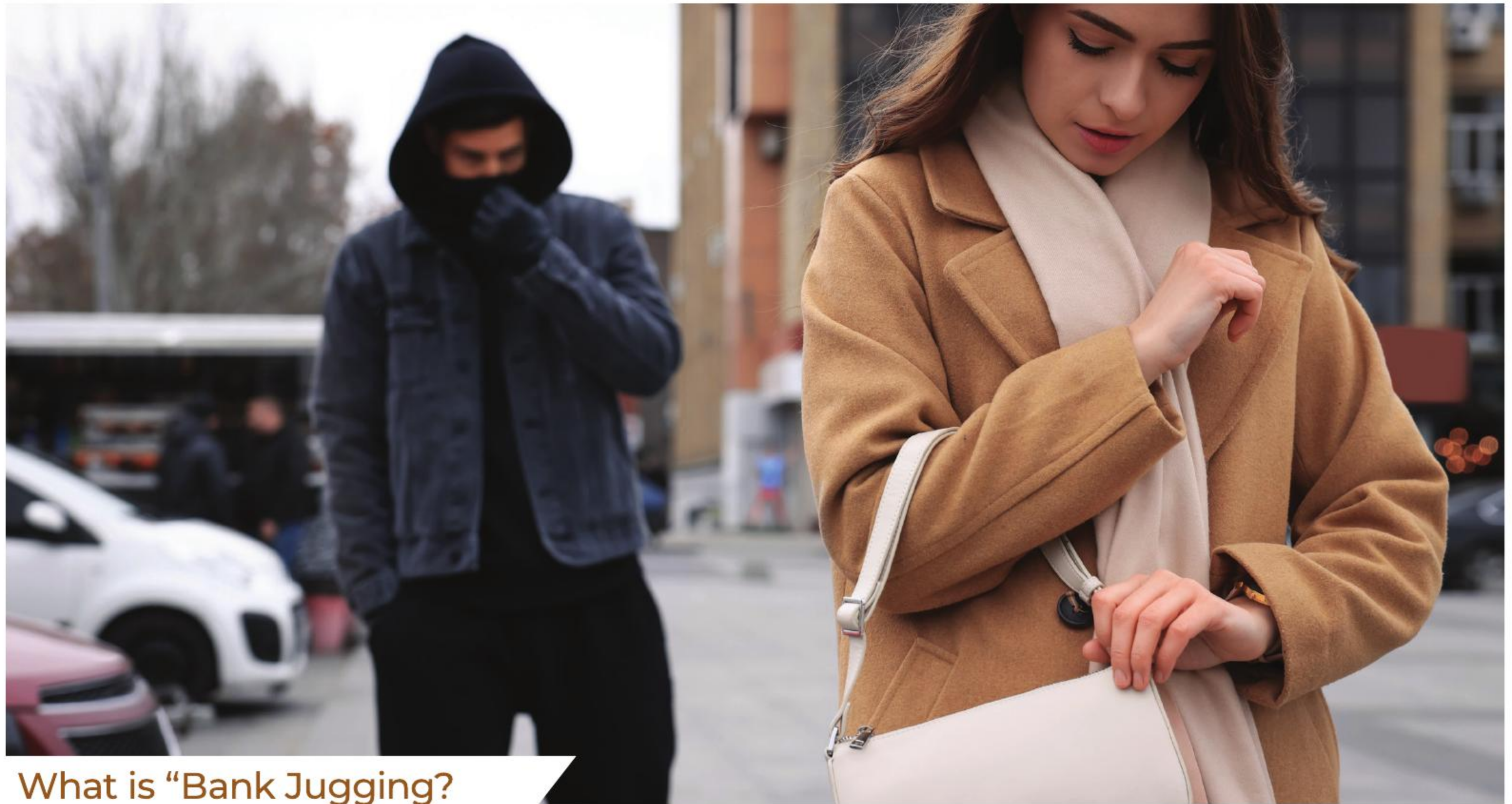

What is “Bank Jugging?”

Bank Jugging occurs when a thief parks outside of a bank and watches patiently as customers go in and out. The thief targets anyone who comes out with a bank bag, coin box, or bank envelope that looks like they may have a large amount of cash. The thief then follows the customer and burglarizes the victim’s car or the victim directly. Most often the crime occurs when the victim stops after leaving a bank, restaurant, grocery store, or even a residence. When the victims attempt to leave their vehicle, they are robbed.

Bank Juggers often park where they have clear visibility of the front door, a commercial drive thru lane, or an ATM. If the line of visibility is obscured, they will change parking spots. Be aware of vehicles who are parked but no occupants enter the bank.

How to prevent bank jugging:

1. Be aware of your surroundings, especially if something seems strange as you enter the bank.
2. Conceal your bank deposit bags, coin boxes, or envelopes as you enter and leave the bank.
3. If you feel like you are being followed, call 911 and drive to a police station.
4. Take your bank bag or envelope with you into your next destination. Don’t hide it in your vehicle.

Bank jugging is becoming increasingly prevalent in Texas. It is easy to get in a rush and be distracted, but if you stay aware of your surroundings and report anything suspicious, you can avoid getting “Jugged.”

HOW TO AVOID A SCAM

Know how scammers tell you to pay. Never pay someone who insists you pay with cryptocurrency, a wire transfer service like Western Union or MoneyGram or a gift card. And NEVER deposit a check and send money back to someone.

A True Servant

Officer Jeremy Ruiz is a husband, father, Live Oak Police Department patrol officer, and Air Force Reservist. If you were to meet him as a police officer on a call for service, you would be impressed by his professional appearance, outgoing personality, and customer service attitude.

Jeremy started his law enforcement career with the Bexar County Sheriff's Office in 2010 as a Sheriff's deputy. In 2015, he became a member of the Live Oak Police Department. If you were to speak with any of Jeremy's supervisors, they would tell you he sets the standard on how a patrol officer should conduct himself. Jeremy's patrol sergeant recommended him as a Field Training Officer (FTO) for newly hired, probationary officers.



Recently, Jeremy was awarded the Law Enforcement Life Saving Award for actions taken during a critical incident. A suicidal individual had self-inflicted deep lacerations to both forearms. Upon arrival at the scene with less experienced police officers, Jeremy was decisive and took charge. Jeremy directed the lifesaving actions of officers to prevent further blood loss and monitored the patient until the arrival of emergency medical services personnel. An emergency room

attending physician said, "But for the actions of officers on scene, the patient would have succumbed to his injuries."

Serving the residents is not the only part of Jeremy's service. He serves his country as a senior non-commissioned Officer in the United States Air Force Reserve.



Master Sergeant (MSgt) Ruiz entered the Air Force Reserve in 2005. After successfully completing basic military training, he was selected for and completed the Security Forces Apprentice Course in 2006. He is currently assigned to the 149th Fighter Wing, 149th Security Forces Squadron, Lackland AFB, Texas.

As Delta Squad Leader, Jeremy is responsible for the supervision, training, and readiness of all personnel under his command. He is a certified traffic management and collision investigator, and is certified as a tactical automated sensor operator, responsible for all thermal imaging cameras. Prior to being deployed to the Afghanistan area of combat, MSgt Ruiz was selected and trained as a protective services detail member. The Protective Service Detail supplies personal protection for senior combat commanders deployed to combat areas. This elite group of armed forces personnel is responsible for the planning, protection, and safe movement of senior commanders both on and off military installations.

Jeremy's most recent assignment was in support of Operation Lone Star on the Texas-Mexico border. He was assigned to the Texas Department of Public Safety in conjunction with The Department of Homeland Security's Border Patrol. His primary duty was to aid members of the Border Patrol in the deterrence of illegal entry into the United States and provide humanitarian relief when needed.

If Trees Could *Talk*

Did You Know...

The very first Arbor Day in the United States was celebrated April 1872 in Nebraska, when the idea of an official day promoting and planting trees was born. However, the problem for Texas is that we can still see temperatures well into the 80s with heat indexes into the 90s in April. Texas now celebrates Arbor Day in November.

Why November?

Because in Texas it's the best time to plant trees due to the cooler temperatures of the Fall season. Trees planted in the spring can establish themselves, but fall is the better time to plant new trees. Cooler temperatures create more favorable conditions for a successful transition into the tree's permanent home. This is why in 2013, Texas established Texas State Arbor Day, which falls on the first Friday of November.

Each year the official celebration is celebrated differently depending on which city you visit. This year's festivities hosted by the Live Oak Village Garden Club and the City of Live Oak Tree Care Board will take place at Crestview Elementary School on Friday, November 3rd. In keeping with tradition, the annual poster contest winners will receive awards for the best designs highlighting this year's theme "If Trees Could Talk." Texas A&M Forest Service's Regional Community Forester Mark Kroeze will be on hand to teach students about the importance of trees and how healthy trees benefit them and the community.

How Can You Prevent Stormwater Pollution?

Team Live Oak asks for your help in keeping all debris including grass clippings and residential trash clear from City drains. To make a difference when walking around the community, keep an eye out for any clogged areas and report them to our office at mypw@liveoaktx.net. A crew will be sent to clear the drains to ensure an adequate flow. City crews routinely clear drains but if a large rain happens and the drains are clogged flooding can occur.

All types of debris end up discharging into waterways as sediment, sludge, detergents, and solids. These can be caught in expensive stormwater treatment filters. However, the most effective way to reduce this problem is preventing pollution from entering the stormwater system in the first place. During the fall, a bad habit of communities is to sweep leaves and other organic debris into the streets which then finds its way to storm grates. People may think, "This will decompose, so it won't hurt the water supply like other trash." While they are right about organic debris being able to decompose, they are wrong about the harm it can do because it doesn't break down as fast as they think. Leaves and other organic debris can clog storm drains as easily as trash and should not be swept toward the street and eventually to the drains.

We hope if you see plastic, bottles, or cardboard on sidewalks or in the neighborhood streets, you will pick them up and dispose of them properly. This simple act will make a difference in keeping our premier community clean and the drains working properly.
