Dear Residents,

In a small suburb that quickly transitioned from a bedroom community to one of the regions fastest-growing cities and one that is continually moving forward, City Council and I believe our residents should know how their community is changing every step of the way. Their voices matter! On Tuesday, September 12th, Council plans to approve the 2017/2018 budget after months of review, receiving public comments and discussions with each department head. The new budget includes maintaining a low tax rate comparable to the region while maintaining quality city services, providing park bathroom improvements and enhancements, maintaining personnel and providing the amenities that our residents are accustomed to enjoying while increasing the quality of life in Live Oak for all ages.

We saw the residents' desire for inclusion during the budget process as an opportunity to provide a better understanding. With transparency as our goal, the public hearings were set to create an environment where those who wanted to learn about the process or who wanted to speak out on their concerns and ideas had the opportunity to do it first-hand. All residents have ideas to contribute that can be of value to city leaders and it was our job to go into the community and seek them out or listen carefully to the "citizens to be heard" during our meetings. After visiting with constituents and considering their concerns, we feel the 2017/2018 Budget was written to meet our citizen's needs along with city operating needs.

Every year, the budget process becomes a common vision of both city officials and the citizens of Live Oak to ensure that our neighborhoods remain a place where all families can thrive and have access to services and opportunities they need. The Council and I find that community decision making is a powerful mechanism for great changes for our community. It was critical that we kept our doors open and invited residents in to observe and experience our work, in hopes that this would be the catalyst to bridge any division between our residents and the city government that serves them. City Council wants you to feel connected and understand the "why" behind our decisions. You are always welcome to contact any of your Live Oak Council members personally about any subject.

Lastly, we invite you all to join us at the ShinDig on Shin Oak on September 29th for lots of family fun and a concert featuring the Spazmatics and the 34th Annual National Night Out on October 3rd for a community crime prevention and safety awareness event within your neighborhoods. I would also like to thank each member of TML, city staff and our residents for the support, direction and commitment during my term as TML President and for allowing me the opportunity to represent you and the State of Texas this past year. 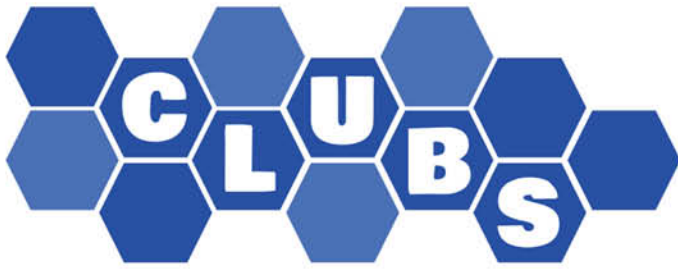

Oak Wilt Sealant Spray Now Available

Oak wilt is a serious tree disease affecting live oaks and red oaks across Texas. Staff in Public Works asks that you beware of fraudulent claims about organic remedies as a treatment for oak wilt. Misinformation has been the cause of the problem worsening. The proper method to prevent your trees from this unfortunate disease is to ensure all tree wounds or cuts are sprayed within 30 minutes or less with an approved pruning paint with pesticide. Pruning paint is the best defense but a spray paint can also be used. We are introducing a new "check out system" to assist our residents in treating fresh cuts or wounds. Call or stop by Public Works during normal business hours and check out a can of sealant spray then return it when you're done. 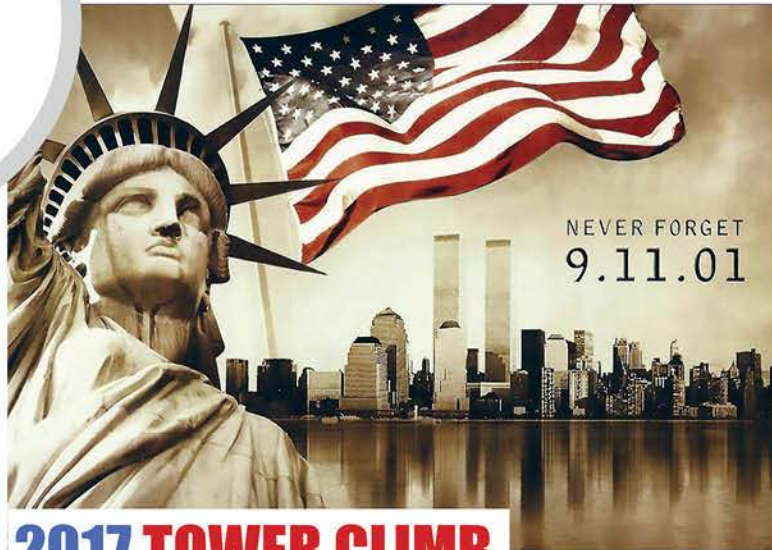

Schools are back in session. The Judson ISD campuses opened August 28, 2017. We have two elementary schools here in Live Oak, Crestview Elementary on Narrow Pass and Ed Franz Elementary on Welcome Dr. The first few days of school are very hectic. Parents want to walk their children to their classrooms and parking around the schools is very limited as well as the residential streets being narrow. Here are a few reminders that should help you.

- First and foremost is the safety of pedestrians
- Be observant and obey all traffic laws
- Watch for all stop signs and crosswalks
- It is illegal to stop, stand or park your vehicle in a crosswalk
- You must also remember to park at least 20 feet from a crosswalk
- Do not park and block driveways
- Use of cellular phones in school zones is prohibited unless you are legally parked or using a hands free device

Parents that wish to walk their children to their classrooms should be prepared to leave home early. When you pack your child's lunch be sure and pack a big bag of patience for yourself. You most likely will not find a parking place near the school. Be prepared to walk. Police officers will have coned off curb lines to prevent people from parking on both sides of the street. This is not done to make things difficult for you, but it is necessary to allow for the operation of large school buses and maintain a 2-way traffic flow. A much easier option is the drop off line at each school. This will allow you to drop your



children off at the door. If using this option remember to form a single line entering the parking lot. Left turns into the school parking lots are prohibited by city ordinance during school hours. Again this is meant to keep traffic flowing safely. Remember to leave early and be patient. It's all about the safety of the children.

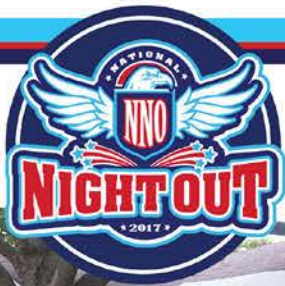


NATIONAL NIGHT OUT 2017

Incentives, Incentives, Incentives!

The hottest incentive package that the city's Economic Development Corporation can offer your business is the Visual Improvements Program or as we refer to it...VIP! What is the VIP and how can it benefit your business? Whether you are a large or small anchor, new or old business, we are here to say the VIP program can help you! The broad purpose of the Visual Improvements Program is to promote a positive city image reflecting order, harmony, and pride, thereby strengthening the economic stability in Live Oak business areas. The foremost purpose is to encourage the visual improvement and enhancement of facades, business signage, landscaping, and parking lots for commercial, professional, and retail in Live Oak.

If your business building exterior or signage needs a little TLC, then this program is for you! The funding available is based on a reimbursement up to a maximum of \$2,000 per business. The cumulative amount awarded by the Live Oak Economic Development Corporation (LOEDC) shall not exceed \$45,000 for each fiscal year of this program.

Are you eligible? If you are either the property owner or the business owner (tenant), you are eligible for the funding. Property owners with multiple buildings or tenants with multiple operating locations may be limited to one building or location per funding cycle. Once you submit your application and related documents to city staff describing the proposed work including three bids, the application will be presented before the EDC Board. Should the project and contractor receive approval from the Board; the EDC will pass a Resolution for payment of up to \$2,000 to the contractor of your choice. Should the project exceed \$2,000, the applicant is responsible for satisfying the remaining cost incurred on behalf of the project. The LOEDC will issue a deposit check not to exceed \$1,000 to the contractor prior to project commencement. Once the project is completed and has passed all permitting and inspection requirements by the city's Building Official, the balance of grant monies will be paid to the contractor.

All VIP projects awarded grant monies must start construction within 90 days of being awarded funding; all projects must be completed within one year of being awarded. Work that qualifies for reimbursement includes improvements to the exterior of buildings such as painting, cleaning, tuck pointing, façade and window repair/replacement, doorways, lighting, new signage, window tinting, replacement awnings, permanent landscaping,

BE AIR AWARE: Make a Commitment to Idle Less

Idling is leaving a vehicle's engine on while the vehicle isn't moving. The Alamo Area Council of Governments is asking Greater San Antonio Area residents to reduce idling this summer when possible, because it wastes fuel and pollutes the air.



Facts About Idling

- Two minutes spent idling is equivalent to one mile of driving in terms of gasoline used.
- Idling a vehicle for 10 seconds wastes more fuel than restarting it.
- Excessive idling can damage cylinders, spark plugs, and exhaust systems.
- Restarting a car has little impact on its battery or starter motor.
- Burning just one gallon of gas produces twenty pounds of pollutants.

Reasons To Reduce Idling

- **Protect health** - Vehicle engines emit gasses that form ozone, a component of smog. Exposure to ozone can cause difficulty or painful breathing, and even permanent lung damage. Although everyone is susceptible to ozone pollution, children, people with respiratory conditions, and those who are active outdoors are at an increased risk.
- **Save money on gasoline** - Owners of an average four-cylinder sedan would save 32 gallons of gas and \$64 every year by reducing idling by eight minutes per day, while owners of an average eight-cylinder SUV or truck would save 64 gallons of gas and \$128 a year.

How to reduce idling

- **Skip the drive-thru lane** - Park and go inside instead! According to a study by QSR Magazine, drive-thru lunch orders take an average of 214 seconds, while drive-thru dinner orders typically take 226.
- **Turn off your car when waiting** - Whether you're waiting to pick up your child from school or sitting in the parking lot before work, turn off your vehicle. Just roll down your windows if it's hot, or switch to "accessory" mode if you want to listen to the radio.
- **Avoid peak traffic times** - The worst times for traffic congestion are between 8-9 a.m. and 5-6 p.m. You're more likely to idle in traffic during these times, wasting both gas and money. If possible, run errands at another time. If you regularly commute to work or school during these times, consider working with your employer to change your schedule.


